



Tunnel Trail Walk

Please retain these terms and conditions for future reference.

RULES & EVENT REGULATIONS

- This agreement starts with the entry. The organisation reserves the right to make any necessary changes or even to cancel the whole event according to safety considerations, official orders, government laws or other unforeseen events.
- Every walker is responsible for themselves and their clothing/equipment.
- All walkers must register at the Event Registration and collect a wristband which should remain readable throughout the event before they start the walk.
- If you retire from the event for any reason, it's important that you inform an event official before leaving.
- All instructions given by event officials must be observed.
- Entries will be taken online and will be given on a first come first served basis.
- All equipment used at an event must be fit for purpose and used at your own risk.
- Walkers must obey all event marshals' and event officials' instructions.
- Use of a music player or other similar device with headphones is not permitted.
- The Borders are beautiful – please don't drop any litter.
- The event will take place regardless of bad weather, unless the organisers deem there is a safety concern. If the event is stopped or re-routed for reasons of safety, there will be no refund available.

GUIDELINES

- The walk begins after the Tunnel Trail Run at approx 1:45pm and you should expect to complete the walk within 60 minutes. Please remember the walk is an outdoor event on single track trails with uneven surfaces.
- The path includes some steep slopes and uneven surfaces. Please be careful and keep to the official path at all times.
- Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult.
- If a marshal asks you to do something, for your own safety, please comply with their request.
- The walk and paths are unfortunately not suitable for wheelchairs or buggies and prams.
- No dogs are allowed on the walk.
- No smoking or alcohol allowed on the walk.
- Please wear warm, waterproof clothing and sturdy walking shoes. Please clean your shoes before arriving to help prevent risk of disease to the forests.



- The tunnel itself is approximately 600 yards and is a dark, enclosed space. Only use a torch in an emergency in the unlikely event of a power failure as it may spoil the lighting effects in the tunnel.
- It is not recommended that photo sensitive epileptics attend this event due to the nature of some aspects of the lighting in the tunnel

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Walkers attend the event on their own account and at their own risk. The organisers are not responsible and cannot be held responsible for any injuries and/or damages as results of any action during the event.
- If an official car park is offered during the event, usage of this will be at your own risk. The organisation is not responsible and cannot be held responsible for any loss, theft and/or damage as a result of this.
- Entry/Registration is only available through the system on this website.
- If the registered walker cannot attend the event, they have no right to reclaim the registration fee.

CANCELLATION POLICY

- If the safety of walkers and staff becomes an issue we may have to cancel an event, or if we have to cancel the event for reasons outwith our control, this will be announced on our website as soon as possible before the event, and participants will be contacted by the Event Organisers.
- If an event is cancelled due to adverse or dangerous conditions any time after 17.00 on the Thursday before the event we will refund a percentage of the entry fee taking in account any outlaid costs.
- Refunds for participants wishing to cancel their entry are not available.
- Deferral of entries to a later date is not possible.

WAIVER OF LIABILITY

- Every participant understands and admits that his participation in the event is voluntary. He assumes full responsibility for any injuries or damages from his participation in the event. He recognises and understands that the activities may be hazardous, that his participation is solely at his own risk and that he assumes full responsibility for any resulting injuries and damages that may occur.
- Every walker affirms, that he is in good health. He declares that he is physically fit and capable to participate in the event.
- Every walker has to acknowledge that he has read and understand this entire waiver of liability and agrees to be legally bound by it.



WITHDRAWAL

- The event officials hold the right to withdraw starters if they feel there is a danger either for the starter or any other person.

REGISTRATION TERMS

- By using this system to register your details, or enter an event you consent to the conditions described below:
- You must be at least 16 years old to use this entry system. You may only use the system for registering your own details and for those of friends, family and club mates who have granted their permission.
- When entering an event we ask for each person's name, date of birth, gender and for any other details necessary for the event. When entering events on behalf of other people you must obtain their permission to provide this data before providing these details on the entry form..

DATA PROTECTION ACT 2018 – Personal Data

- By submitting an application to take part in an event, the participant also allows the event organisers to use personal data for campaigns and activities connected to that event, future editions of that event and other related events.
- The organisers shall have unlimited rights to publish pictures of the participants; to forward these photos to media representatives and to use them for marketing activities.
- The personal data and entry specific information you give will be used by the Event Organisers for the purpose of processing and publishing entries and results and of maintaining participant information. We may pass your information to our third party service providers, agents, subcontractors and other associated organisations for the purposes of event-related activities only, or providing services on our behalf eg. timing. However, when we use third party service providers, we disclose only the personal information that is necessary to deliver the service and never to use it for their own direct marketing or any other purposes. We undertake this data sharing on the basis of our legitimate interests.
- To register for this event you must provide a valid email address so we can send you confirmation of your registration and of any entries you make. The email address supplied (and any email addresses given when registering other people) may be used by the Event Organiser to send out information about the events you enter. It may also be used by them after the event ends to send follow-up information about the event / future events / memberships they may organise.
- Credit and Debit card details are held solely by the Payment Service Provider and are unknown to the Event Organisers.
- In the event of a medical incident information may be shared between the organiser (Hillside Outside Ltd) and the emergency service providers (including but not limited to Tweed



Valley Mountain Rescue, Scottish Ambulance Service, Scottish Police). This ensures that all parties have the information required to provide safety and medical services, to best manage the incident and any subsequent requirements.

CURRENCY OF PURCHASE
